

Mr. Scott Jamieson

Bio:

Scott Jamieson, Director of Engineering – BC at Quanta Telecom Canada (QTC)

Scott Jamieson has over 22 years of fiber network engineering and operations experience as well as a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of British Columbia. Scott founded a2b Fiber Inc., a CRTC registered common carrier which owns and operates next generation open access fibre optic networks in Vancouver and Toronto. Scott was also the National Manager of the Fiber Optic Engineering Department of Group Telecom with management responsibility for a \$100M capital budget for network deployment, 400,000 fibre kilometers of plant and 15 employees in offices from coast to coast.

Scott was Director of Operations for QNet, Canada's first municipal open access optical fibre network utility covering over sixty kilometers of metro area fibre, sixty connected buildings, and two state-of-the-art data centre facilities. Scott is now responsible for planning and implementing engineering services for Quanta Telecom Canada (QTC) throughout the province of British Columbia. QTC is currently working on Engineering, Procurement, and Construction (EPC) contracts in the Fibre-to-the-Home (FtH) and long-haul communications categories.

2. Why do you want to be on the Vanix Board of Directors?

I would like to be on the Board of VANIX to help promote broadband infrastructure in the region. I believe that this region is lacking in both choice and ubiquity of layer zero telecommunications - in particular fibre optic cables and high quality data centres. I believe that latency issues matter and that more capacity and connectivity needs to be proximate to the end-users - our residents and our businesses throughout the lower mainland. I believe that the VANIX is a key component of this region's telecommunications system and it should play a more prominent role in promoting principals of choice and resiliency for our part of the global network.

3. What specific skills or experiences do you have that make you the best candidate for the Vanix Board?

My specific background is in outside plant fibre optic networks and data centre operations. I am also a Director of the BC Broadband Association. My entire career has been dedicated to promoting open broadband infrastructure.

4. What do you feel are the top three challenges and opportunities facing Vanix during the next three to five years?

Our main challenge (for VANIX and telecoms generally) is Harbour Centre. This is not an ideal location for a data centre given the average age of the electrical system in downtown Vancouver, as well as generator, cooling, and space issues. I strongly believe that a carrier neutral data centre that can survive an earthquake is needed in our region.

5. What specific actions do you propose to address one or more of these challenges and opportunities?

I propose to push for VANIX space and power in multiple data centres around the lower

mainland. I will seek long-term low (or no) cost dark fibre between these data centres. I will push for VANIX inclusion in new data centre initiatives.

6. Please describe your understanding of the role of a Director on the Vanix Board.

My role as Director is to provide strategic oversight on the activities of the organization, provide good governance, and advise on items relating to my background in fibre optics and data centres.

I will dedicate the time to meet with the Board at regular meetings.
